
PEBBLE - GIBRALTAR MINE MINE

The comparison the Pebble Limited Partnership (PLP) makes of its proposed Pebble mine to the Gibraltar Mine in British Columbia is misleading. Its claim that a large-scale mine like Pebble and Bristol Bay's fisheries can co-exist is a fallacy.



What PLP wants to build in Bristol Bay is unprecendented.

The proposed Pebble mine would be a much larger mining operation than Gibraltar Mine.
